KEEPING YOU ON TARGET

Drawing on the experience of two decades, our guidance team will draw up a personalized study plan, designed to get you from where you are to where you want to go, giving you, from the very beginning, a clear sense of the big picture.

Credits for Work and Ability

If you have completed high school work in your home country, the guidance office would grant what are called equivalency credits. Students who have completed grade 11 or higher, and show a high level of ability on the Mathematics and English placement tests, may on that basis receive extra equivalency credits.

All Levels

Students who are beginners in English can commence with full-day ESL. Unlike the courses taken in a language school, these would be credit high school courses, which would count toward the 30 credits required for the Ontario Secondary School Diploma.

Based on Your Needs

Students in the Experience Program may also select their courses based on the requirements of their home school.

The Fast-Track Term System

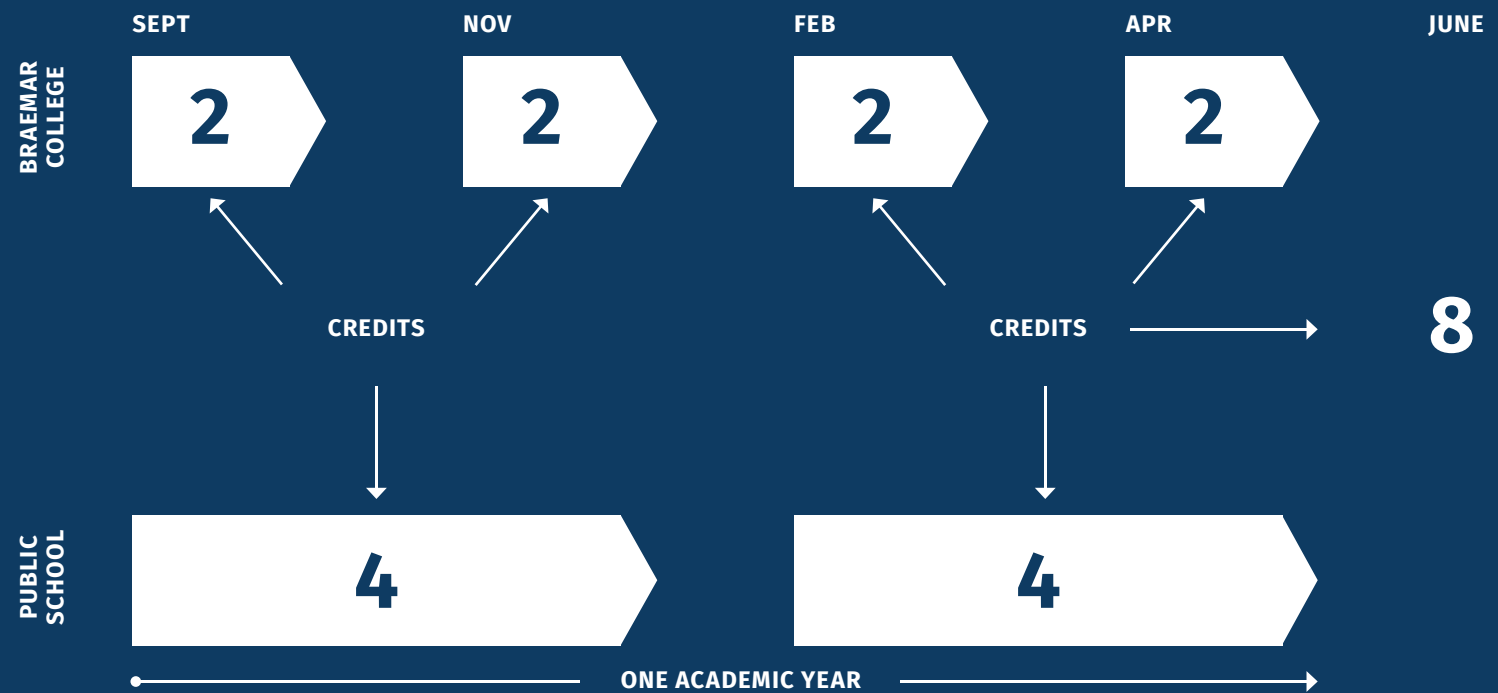
Because of the innovative design of our term system, Braemar College students are able to complete a total of four levels each academic year, compared to only two in most public schools.

The Express Option

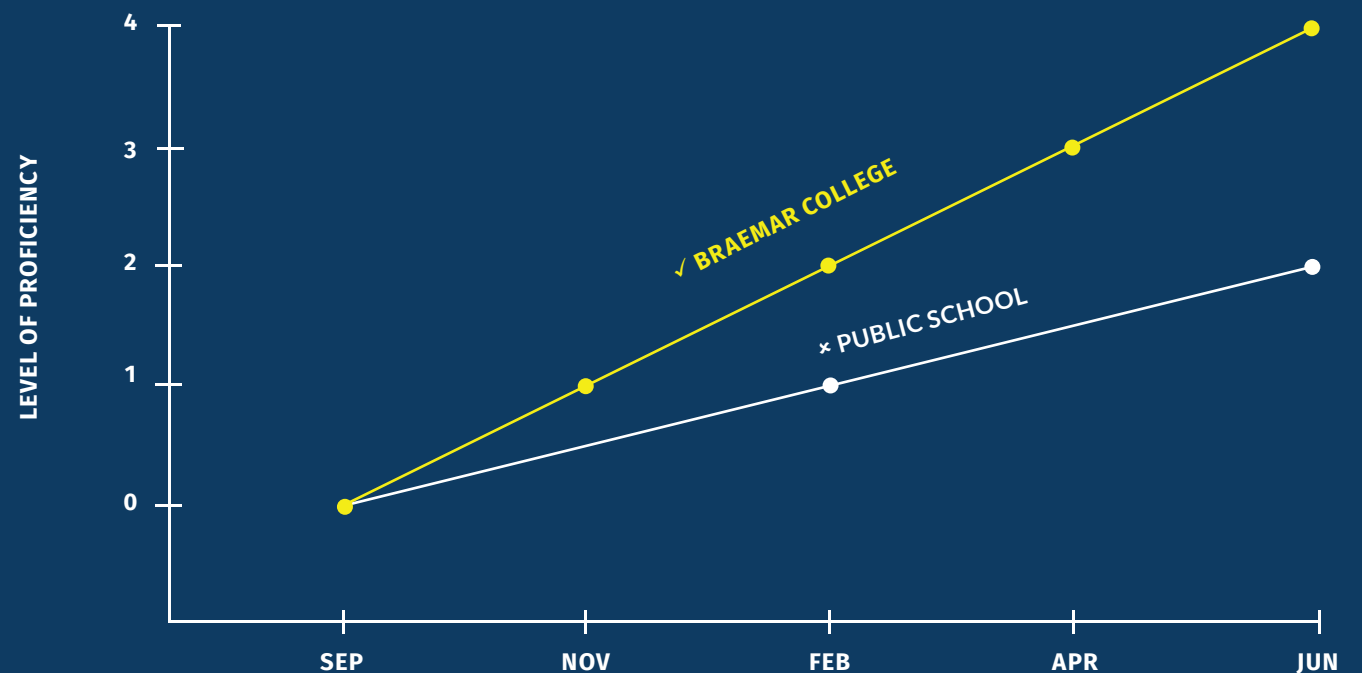

Over the years Braemar College has developed an extensive network of caring and supportive Canadian homestay families. Experience has demonstrated that living with an English-speaking Canadian family will help students learn English more quickly. In addition, the homestay family is a key resource in finding one's way in the new culture.

Our Homestay Commitment

- 1 When the study permit is approved the student provides the school with flight information

ONTARIO SCHOOL SYSTEM

Braemar College is recognized and inspected by the Ontario Ministry of Education.

Diploma

Our graduates receive the Ontario Secondary School Diploma, a high school diploma accepted by post-secondary institutions all around the world.

Flexibility

The OSSD is a flexible document, easily allowing students to get credit for high school work completed in their home country. The number of credits granted may also depend on the Mathematics and English placement tests.

Personalization

After the placement tests, students meet with the guidance team to come up with a detailed study plan. This indicates all courses the student will take from the start to the end ensuring the student is qualified for the university or college program of their choice.

REFUND POLICY

NOTES

For the purpose of obtaining a refund of tuition or other fees, applicants are divided into two categories. Please check carefully to see which category you fit into. If you require further details on our policy please do not hesitate to contact us.

Category A

All applicants who are Canadian citizens, have Permit Residence status in Canada, or are present in the country on a Minister's Permit, are entitled to a full refund of tuition and other fees (less any applicable administrative fees) if the following conditions are met:

I) That the College is in receipt of tuition or other fees paid by, or on behalf of the applicant for the purpose of subsequently attending an educational program at the College, and;

II) That the applicant provide the College a minimum two week's written notification (via email to info@braemarcollege.com) prior to the date he/she was scheduled to commence, resume or continue his/her studies. (For the purpose of notification the date is that upon which the College receives written notification).

Postponing Commencement Date: If the applicant wishes to postpone the date on which he/she will commence, resume or continue his/her studies, and complies with the conditions in I & II above, he/she can do so without financial penalty. All tuition paid will be applied to credit courses taken by that applicant in subsequent semesters. Two weeks written notice is required). A failure to notify the College within the specified timeline to effectuate a postponement of studies will result in the loss of tuition applicable to the term in question. The balance of the tuition paid, however, may be applied to future study or refund.

Category B

All applicants who are by law required to obtain a Study Permit or Visitor's Visa in order to study in Canada (or extend his/her stay in Canada) are entitled to a full refund (less any applicable administrative fees) provided the following conditions are met:

I) The Applicant's application to obtain a Study Permit or Visitor's Visa has been rejected by a Canadian Embassy or Consulate; and,

II) The Applicant provide the College with the letter issued by the Canadian Embassy or Consulate stating that the Applicant's application has been rejected; and,

III) The College is in receipt of tuition or other fees paid by, or on behalf of that Applicant, for the purpose of studying at the College.

Postponing Commencement Date: If the applicant wishes to postpone the date on which he/she will commence, resume or continue his/her studies, and complies with the conditions in I & II above, he/she can do so without financial penalty. All tuition paid will be applied to credit courses taken by that applicant in subsequent semesters. Two weeks written notice is required). A failure to notify the College within the specified timeline to effectuate a postponement of studies will result in the loss of tuition applicable to the term in question. The balance of the tuition paid, however, may be used at a later date but is non-refundable.

The term 'applicant' is herein used to denote candidates applying to the College for admission, as well as those who are attending, or have attended the College.

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
