TUTORING CENTRES

Tutoring is available at all campuses through Library and Learning Services. Students can book an appointment with a tutor through an online booking system.

Learning Assistants provide tutoring to Sheridan students at no additional cost in a variety of subjects, such as English, math, architecture, interior design and decorating, accounting, finance, computer programming, chemistry, and more. Assistants are co-op students who work in the Tutoring Centres on each campus.

Practice in conversation skills, basic computing skills and presentation skills is also available in a group setting.

Peer-Assisted Learning (PAL) leaders are available in a variety of first-year courses too. PAL leaders are Sheridan students who are recommended by faculty and who help other students review notes, discuss readings, develop study skills, and prepare for tests and assignments.

Peer tutors offer course-specific tutoring in subjects outside of those provided by the Learning Assistants. Peer tutors are Sheridan students who earn a grade of 76% or higher in the course they tutor in, and are referred by professors.

1 Find the right program for you

2 Check the admission requirements

Check the admission requirements for your program of choice online or pages 12–23. International applicants must meet the course equivalencies of the Canadian admission requirements. For full details on additional, program-specific requirements (such as portfolios or résumés), go online to sheridancollege.ca, click *Programs* and then choose the programs you're interested in.

3 Apply online and pay the application fee

You can apply online at internationalapplication.sheridancollege.ca

You'll need a computer with an Internet connection and a way to pay the application fee (VISA, MasterCard or Bank Wire Transfer). The “equal consideration” date for September intake is February 1, 2020 (we encourage you to apply before then). We'll accept your application after that date provided the program is still open as indicated on our website.

4 Submit your documentation

In order for us to process your application, all academic documents must include your Sheridan ID number and date of birth. Please upload academic documents to internationalapplication.sheridancollege.ca/SubmitDocument1.aspx

Note: Only upload documents if you have completed a successful application and received a student ID number. Please note that these documents must be accompanied by a notarized, official translation into English along with original transcript in your native language.

DO NOT include portfolio attachments. (Refer to the Applicant Selection Information for specific portfolio instructions. Applicants to programs which require a portfolio assessment will have access to view this information via *myStudent Centre* using their account information.)

5 I've applied. Now what?

Please check your *myStudentCentre* account for any additional admission requirements that may be required such as a portfolio. Please be sure to meet all deadlines for accepting your offer and paying your fees. Decisions to applicants will be communicated by email. Applicants who are offered admission to a program must accept their offer. Once we receive your acceptance of our offer of admission, the invoice for your program will be available online through *myStudentCentre*.

What you need to get where you want

UNDERGRADUATE

Applicants may be admitted to Sheridan as full-time students if they have an Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent high school diploma including one senior-level English or equivalent IELTS/TOEFL plus any additional required courses listed. Eligible applicants will be selected on the basis of their previous academic achievement.

POST-GRADUATE PROGRAMS

To be considered for admission an applicant must have a minimum postsecondary diploma or degree.

Eligible applicants are selected on the basis of previous academic achievement, and/or demonstrated experience and additional admission requirements where required.

ENGLISH PROFICIENCY

All applicants to Sheridan must demonstrate competency in English and may be required to complete English testing. Sheridan recognizes valid TOEFL and IELTS scores.

Applicants with a minimum of three years high school in Canada, Australia, Ghana, Kenya, Nigeria, New Zealand, Singapore, U.S., U.K. and some Caribbean* countries will be exempted from TOEFL/IELTS requirements upon provision of a full transcript.

Applicants from Canadian curriculum high schools outside of Canada with minimum of three years high school credits will be exempted from TOEFL/IELTS requirements upon provision of a full transcript.

*Excluding International applicants from Cuba, Dominican Republic, Haiti, Puerto Rico and other countries where the curriculum is not taught in English.

Successful completion of at least two years of study in an accredited college in English is sufficient to demonstrate competency in English.

Successful completion of at least one year of study in an accredited university, or successful completion of a one-year post-graduate certificate at an accredited college in English is sufficient to demonstrate competency in English.

Sheridan reserves the right to require proof of proficiency in English from any applicant, or applicants, from individual schools, school systems, regions or countries. Applicants may be required to complete English testing to demonstrate proficiency.

HONOURS BACHELOR OF ANIMATION (2011),
FACULTY OF ANIMATION, ARTS & DESIGN

Domee Shi's bite-sized hero took her straight to the Academy Awards, where she landed an Oscar for Best Animated Short and earned a place in filmmaking history.

Bao, which was partially inspired by Shi's own mother, tells the story of an aging Chinese woman who gets another chance at motherhood when one of her dumplings springs to life. Shi, who was born in China and moved to Toronto with her family when she was two, is notably the first female director to helm a Pixar short film. *Bao* earned Shi her first Oscar in February 2019 in the Best Animated Short Film category.

The word "bao" can mean "steamed bun" or "something precious,"

depending on its pronunciation.

"Growing up as an only child to my Chinese parents, ever since I was little my mom would treat me like her own precious dumpling, making sure I didn't wander off or get into trouble," she explains.

Shi first applied to Pixar's internship program during her third year at Sheridan. After being rejected, she was inspired to work harder and add more depth to her portfolio, leading her to be accepted to the internship the

following year. She was hired by Pixar shortly after, and has since worked on features including *Inside Out*, *The Good Dinosaur*, *Toy Story 4* and *Incredibles 2*. She is currently developing a feature film at Pixar.

"I really felt like I found my tribe in the Animation program...We would motivate each other, we would inspire each other, we would share movies and techniques...we would push each other to do better."

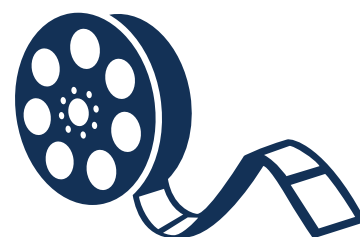

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English as a Second Language (ESL)

Sheridan offers full-time, intensive English as a Second Language (ESL) classes for students who want to improve their English skills. The program features:

- Five levels of instruction: Foundation, Pre-intermediate, Intermediate, Advanced and English for Academic Purposes (EAP). EAP can provide students with a conditional acceptance into a diploma, degree or post-graduate certificate at Sheridan.
- Students will be placed in the appropriate level based on their choice of TOEFL, IELTS or Sheridan's on-campus placement test.

ESL sessions except for EAP level last seven weeks (25 hours of study/week) and cost \$3,440 CDN. This includes tuition, health insurance and use of the computer lab.

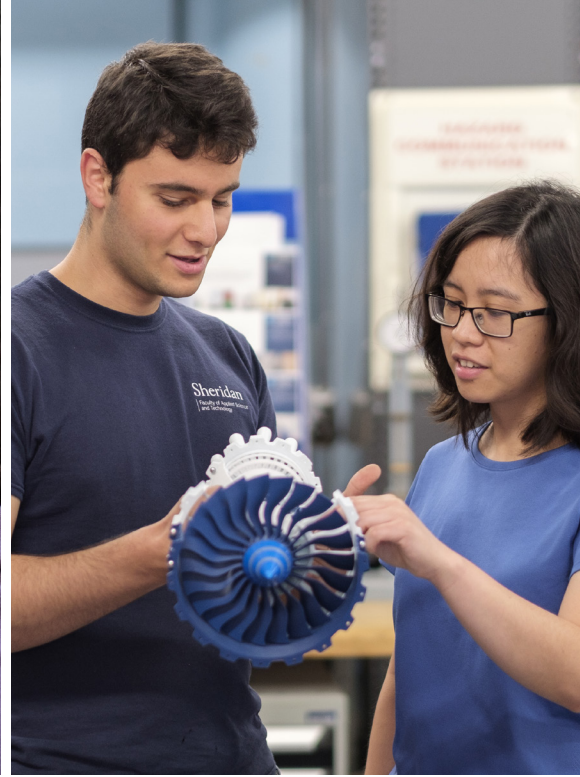
